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Quayola- Vestiges: personal exhibition at the Charlot Gallery



On the occasion of his exhibition "Vestiges" at the Charlot Gallery, artist Quayola introduces the French public to his questioning around the technological representation of the immeasurable - or in other words, the perception of nature by the machine.

Beyond the simple mimicry, the artist is here archivist of natural data emanating from the gardens of the Castle of Chaumont-sur-Loire. Through sophisticated technological tools, Quayola "scans" nature, thus confronting his artistic subjectivity with that of his tool. From this hybridization are born innovative visuals testimonies of a new pictorial reality - between real dystopia and natural dream. By making visible the "natural" limits of photogrammetric capture, Quayola's work underlines the ambiguity of hyperrealism advocated by digital imaging technologies, thus questioning "what this aesthetics of dysfunction reveals about the relationship of the subject to nature and the world ".

Quyola's work revolves around some of the ambiguities of the Anthropocene; between real and artificial, figurative and abstract, archaic and innovative ... His work explores photography, geometry, temporal digital sculptures and immersive installations and audiovisual performances.
